Ultrasound – One year Followup



For years after the Supreme Council launched its Ultrasound Initiative the Grand Strand area lacked any pro-life clinic which could benefit

from this important program. That finally changed with the opening of Coastline Women's Center (CWC) in Conway, SC. The presence of a clinic possibly meeting the K of C requirements for accepting an ultrasound became known to Charles Andrew Smith Council 7531 in late 2015. Once all the inspections, checks and forms had been completed and approved, Council 7531 launched its fund-raising effort among the Councils of Districts 3 and 11 in January 2016. In a mere 100 days the required \$15,000 had been raised. Seen above is State Deputy Mike Allen addressing the grand opening crowd on August 20, 2016. Now for the good news: CWC reports that during its first year of operation an average of 1-2 women each week who are leaning toward

Our seminarians come from a wide variety of backgrounds but are united in their call to serve the Lord. Nick Shiver comes from Christ the King Parish in Mount Pleasant. He spent his first two years of college at West Point and joined the seminary last year and attended Holy Trinity Seminary in Dallas. This fall he will be going to the Theological College at the Catholic University of America in Washington DC.

Each summer, our seminarians do work in the parishes, attend seminars and do a wide variety of assignments to expand their experiences in their faith. One seminarian across the country is chosen to work at Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, NM to work alongside of the Catholic Chaplains that come in to minister to the needs of the Catholic Scouts that do a trek in the mountains at Philmont. Nick was chosen to work for the summer. Priests come and go but Nick was there for the full summer.

Although this was his first scouting experience, he had the chance to work with different priests each week and learn from them. This exposure gave him a chance to see how different priests handle challenges in their own unique ways.

The job of the chaplain at Philmont is to handle chapel services at the training center, to deliver messages from home of a death or sickness in the family, to work at the clinic with scouts that are injured or sick, crew conflicts, and to help prepare for Mass for the priests. It has given Nick a chance to put his faith in action.

Nick was very impressed with the mission and ideals of the scouting movement and especially Philmont Scout Ranch. He saw young men and women that were very confident and well prepared for the strenuous backpacking treks that would start at 6,600 feet above sea level and go to 12,000 feet. Each day was refreshing to him because of the physical beauty of the area. On 140,000 acres, the scouts had the chance to escape the dependence on cell phones and be able to experience God's Country.

Patriot's Corner

Worthy State Officers, Past State Deputies, Former Vise Supreme Masters and Former District Masters, District Staff, Faithful Navigators, and Brother Sir Knights,

Earlier this week, I e-mailed you about the change in uniform. It is a navy-blue blazer with the Fourth Degree emblem, dark grey slacks, a Fourth Degree tie, a white shirt, and beret. There was limited information at the time, and I promised to provide additional information when I had it. Yesterday, I got more information from our Vise Supreme Master Robert Anderson and had a chance to talk to him. Let me share the additional information and insight.

Let me summarize. The "new" uniform is now the official uniform of the Fourth Degree. However,

Social Functions: Sir Knights may continue to wear a black bow tie, plain white tuxedo shirt, black cummerbund, black socks, plain black shoes, black tuxedo and social baldric worn under the coat, from right shoulder to left hip (hence forth known in this letter as "black tux") at social functions. They may also wear the new uniform.

Color Corps: Sir Knight may continue to where their black tux with cape, chapeaux, and swords for Color Corps (i.e. Honor Guards and Color Guards.)

•Though I speculate, that the sale of capes and chapeaux with last only as long as supplies last, and then will be discontinued.

·I also speculate that capes and chapeaus will someday not be part of the Color Corps. But this is only my speculation. But Sir Knights with black tux will stand side by side with Sir Knights in the new uniform.

•No mention has been made about the sword. Right now, those wearing the new uniform should not wear a sword. It is being studied, but after talking to the Vise Supreme Master, I am optimistic that the sword will not disappear. Official Uniform:

•Sir Knight may obtain the new uniform which will be offered on "Knight Gear" on the Supreme web site soon.

•When a Sir Knight wears the new uniform, they should not wear cape and chapeaux, (or sword at this time.) Exemplifications

•Candidates shall wear a black or dark (blue or grey) business SUIT with black socks with black shoes, white dress shirt and tie.

- · Sir Knights shall wear
- o New Uniform, or

Black Tux, or

o Black Tux with regalia (which I highly encourage.)

To help, I have included the best information I have on the actual changes to the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus and have shown them on Attachment 1 my comment,

Let's talk about the New Fourth Degree Uniform change. Supreme announced on Tuesday, August 1, 2017, a new Fourth Degree Uniform. Some will welcome this change expounding on it's smart, modern, professional look. Others will not like any change. But change in the uniform is not new. Prior to 1940, the uniform of the Fourth Degree was white tie and tails. In 1940, Supreme introduce the new



uniform - the tuxedo. When I took my Fourth Degree in 1972, the District Masters in South Carolina were still wearing tails. And I can personally attest that all South Carolina District Marshalls wore tails until 1984. My point is, that whether you like the new uniform or not, I expect the tuxedo will be around for many years. The 300,000 exist-

ing Fourth Degree Sir Knights are not going to rush out and buy a new uniform. It just is not going to happen, especially at a cost of over \$500. The Supreme web site states "assemblies may choose to continue using the traditional cape and chapeau for color corps at public events and honor guards in liturgical processions. However, the preferred dress for the Fourth Degree is the new uniform."

District Master Joseph J. Monahon, Jr. in tails with Faithful Navigator James Anderson in tuxedo — circa 1963, (20+ years after tuxedos were made the official uniform.)

Now let's focus on what is important. Fourth Degree Sir Knights hold unwaveringly to what is right and honorable. We work to keep God in the civic arena; to serve the life of the Church; and to defend laws that recognize the sanctity of life and true religious liberty. This is what the Fourth Degree is about. While the cape, chapeaux, and sword are worn with pride, we are not defined by what we wear, but by what we do. Let's focus on what is important.

As in my first letter, I urge restraint, calm and maturity in this discussion. I continue to urge you to do so. I am not telling you that you must like the change. But the decision has been made. Let's focus on what is important.

What kind of soil are we?

The Gospel from a few weeks ago about sowing seeds can refer to us as Knights of Columbus. By scattering seed on the ground, several will fall on good soil, some seeds will fall on rocky ground, some seeds will fall on pavement, and some seeds will fall on thorny ground. The seed is good, it just depends on which kind of soil it lands on.

The question is, what kind of soil are we?

My Brother Knights, this parable relates to you as you should be sowing seeds in the fertile soil of your respective parishes, recruiting a few good men to the order. Sow the seeds of the Knights of Columbus to all eligible men in your parish. Talk, explain, give them something to think about. Excite them about the Order! Better yet, excite their wives about the Order! Have a family night open house; a pancake breakfast for families at your parish hall; a spaghetti dinner or fish fry. Get them to come out and water the seed that you planted.

The message to us is to sow the best we can, not only to spread Christ's Word as effectively and honestly as we know how, but to spread the message of the Knights of Columbus as well and leave the rest to the mysterious chemistry between seed and soil.

Some seeds will take root and that will make the sowing worthwhile and there will be a harvest from the seed we have sown. We will be able to conduct Admission Degrees and make our council's membership quota. Perhaps you need to be reminded on how your won seed rooted, sprouted shoots and grew, and you discovered what it means to have been called to be a Knight of Columbus. To serve God, to serve our communities, to help those in need. Keep sowing the seeds of faith and the seeds that will attract a few good men to our Order. We are to keep sowing no matter how the soil may look, because we never know where it will take root and produce a harvest of a changed life that will in turn change others. And bring in a new member to our Order, the Knights of Columbus!

a better presentation to the new members. This gives a better impression and a professional look to all attending the degree.

The attached reports show the status of each council for Admission Degrees and the District Formation Degrees for 2017 – 2018. <u>These reports do not show membership intake for</u> <u>councils or districts, they only show either Admission or</u> <u>Formation Degrees held.</u> **PROTOCOL** Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council: It has been noticed that the basic Protocol has been lacking during many visits to Councils and Assemblies throughout the State by many members of the Knights.

When inviting a guest, either Knight of Columbus or someone outside the Knights they need to be sent an invitation to your event, whether it is an installation or a banquet function with a presentation. In some cases it can be an email but if not sure send a paper invite. This should be accomplished at least 30 days in advance. Include the dress code for the event both men and women, time of event and directions. Also consider the option of lodging if they have to travel some distance to the function and the cost should be the invitees. Never use a phone call as the first resort, but it is OK to do a follow up with a phone if you have not gotten a reply in a timely manner. At a function where you have invited a guest, DO NOT leave them alone, assign a member to be with them and introduce them to other members in the room, you can use a team to do this so they will feel more at home. When having a banquet or installation function reserve a place for them and have them at the same table as the GK or FN. They should also be seated with members of the clergy and served or allowed to go first with clergy to the buffet line. Any cost for a banquet/meal should be paid by the inviting organization.

They should be allowed to address the group and told ahead of time how much time they have and should address the group last as they are the highest ranking individual at the function, if they are not then the highest ranking person should speak last. The Grand Knight/Faithful Navigator or master of ceremonies should introduce all guests and people of any status (i.e. PSD, FM, FDD, DD and Clergy) in order from lowest to highest. Be sure to use correct titles.

Formal recognition when presenting an award should be with dignity and fitting of the occasion that the person is being recognized for. Make awards and certificates mean something and that you are proud to present it to them. Certificates should be put into a folder or frame. It does not cost that much and makes it mean so much more that you cared to frame or put it in a folder. Make the presentation at a function or a meeting with others present to join in the joy of the moment. Just a side note you can get frames at the Dollar Tree for only a Dollar or use folders from Supreme.
