Something we haven't done in almost three years. Let's work together to make that goal!

If that doesn't make you proud, this might. The Supreme council has just unveiled its Family Rosary program, just a few days after Jim St. Clair outlined the South Carolina "Silver Rosary" program for this Season. Coincidence? I think not. Jim has the South Carolina Domestic Church program off to a dynamic start and according to the Supreme guys, we are lightyears ahead of the rest of the world. The Domestic Church program is one that every Christian man needs to hear, regardless of which denomination he belongs to.

As I reflect back on my tenure as State Deputy, which will come to a close soon, I see much that makes me hopeful for the future I see a State council coming up that will accomplish many great things keeping in mind that first

## From the Vocations Director

James P. Weiskircher, Vocations Director

This year five new seminarians entered the program for the Diocese of Charleston. Normally, the Miscellany does an article on the seminarians to give us an idea of who these young men are and their backgrounds. I have sent each of the five a few questions so that can give you an idea of who they are and why they entered the program. So far only one has responded to my requests.

Tom Drury is in his first year of Pre-Theology at St. Vincent de Paul Seminary in Boynton Beach, Florida. His home parish is St. Peter's in Beaufort. Tom grew up in New Jersey and went to public high school there and went on to major in Latin American studies. He has two siblings Michael and Lauren. The first time that he thought of becoming a priest was



in his high school years. Tom felt attracted to prayer and the liturgy and its beauty. It's been great to be at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary - it's a very diverse, multilingual and multicultural community. We did have to evacuate seminary in September due to Hurricane Irma, so that was surprising! Family, friends and priests in our diocese encouraged me and inspired me by their own lives of joyful service to the Gospel to enter the seminary. I'm very fortunate to be a seminarian. Seminarians enjoy plentiful time and space for listening to the Holy Spirit. As I get more responses from the seminarians, I will include their responses in my column.

We have been very fortunate to go from 9 seminarians two years ago, to 18 last year, to 21 this year. This poses a challenge to make sure that all seminarians are covered. Normally we do not have an idea until after all forms are turned in which is in July. By then it is too late to make any changes for the coming year. Most seminarians are selected at the beginning of the budget year. Most times, we do not get the information on the newest seminarians until October, well after most budgets are firmed up. The selections are coming from many different areas and groups, ie, priests, fellow Knights, vocations department, Hibernians, and even me. The problem is that this has turned into a situation where some seminarians are being supported by 5-6 councils and one with 8 councils supporting him to the tune of \$4,500. While some have either no support or just one council supporting them.

I would like to thank all of the councils that have responded to my request for who they sponsor. This will help us to develop a program for next fiscal year to even out the support so that we do a better job of making sure each seminarian receives the support that they need.

On average, it takes 11 seminarians going into the program



The State Deputy and I are pleased to see many Districts and Councils active and holding Admission Degrees. Districts 5, 7, 11, 13, 15 and 16 have all councils in their District active in Admission Degree work. The following Councils have either made their Admission Degree goal or are close to making it; Council 13713 Blythewood 100%, Council 11325 Lexington 100%, Council 11910 Summerville 80%, Council 11991 Goose Creek 80% and Council 14475 Lake Wylie 80%. The bad side of this coin is that 16 Councils have not held an Admission degree this year. ### **Building the Domestic Church**

Dear Domestic Church Chair Couples/Directors, February 2018

#### Silver Rosary Award

I announced this project earlier this month at the Mid-Winter Meeting. We had a request to change the start date to Ash Wednesday, February 14th. This change will give everyone reasonable time to announce this project to their Councils. Please be advised that the Silver Rosary Award runs from February 14th to April 15th inclusive. Additionally, I want to emphasize that the rules encourage Knights, spouses and children to participate in this family event. The objective is to draw closer to God and Mary by praying the family rosary daily and respectfully. We are looking for quality time with God, not volumes of hasty prayers said to merely win a contest. Therefore, just one participation by each family member per day is allowed. Saying one rosary counts the same as praying two rosaries. Example one: Knight, wife, and 3 children pray one rosary together on Wednesday. This results in 5 participations for Wednesday. Example two: Knight, wife, and 2 children pray two rosaries on Thursday. This results in 4 participations on Thursday. (One or two rosaries count the same.)

### **Chair Couples vs. Directors**

Supreme Council announced that the State & local Councils should appoint Chair Couples to manage the Domestic Church initiative. I discussed with Supreme two issues that needed addressing. There are the possibilities that the Council Directors appointed last year are doing a terrific job as Domestic Church Director but the wife may not be willing to take on duties as Chair Couple. Perhaps your Council has a Director who is doing a great job, but is a single parent. The Supreme Programs Director, Scott Read, agrees that it is prudent to leave these Knights in place and allow them to continue on. Don't think that you absolutely must replace your Directors with Chair Couples. the State Council: Installations

With election of new officers and installations coming up we need to address the invitation of personnel to the installation of your Council. Your District Deputy must be notified as much in advanced of the installation date you want for your Council. Next you need to send invitations to any State Officers that you want to attend your installation. A letter and personnel invite must be made to your Council Chaplain or any clergy you wish to have there. Make sure when they arrive that you or someone from your Council stays with them and makes them feel at home. When a meal is involved be sure they are seated in a place of honor and go or are served first ahead of members of the council. If they are expected to say something at the installation be sure to notify them of the fact and the amount of time they have to speak. If they ask what you want them to speak on make a suggestion, otherwise leave this to their discretion.

Many of our diocesan deacons are Knights, so maybe you and/or your council can do something extra this Lent by recruiting council members to be adult altar servers at certain Masses that do not normally have altar servers and be of assistance to the deacon and priest. Perhaps you can pray for them and with them. Brothers, use your imagination. Maybe he is having his anniversary of joining the Knights coming up, your council could plan an anniversary party for him. Or, as we recently did at my parish, a retirement party was given in honor of our deacon, a Knight, for his 30+ years as a dedicated deacon for our parish and our local council gave him a certificate of appreciation.

Brothers, all I am saying is that you could do a little more for your clergy at this time of year (not to mention for the seniors that belong to your parish). You do not have to give up chocolate for Lent, add something that will be a benefit for other people. Be creative. Be spiritual! Have a Blessed Lenten Season! 
