Plenary Indulgence Granted to Catholics attending March for Life

Catholics attending this year’s national March for Life in Washington, D.C., have the opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence. As announced in a letter from Bishop Michael Burbidge of Arlington and Cardinal Donald Wuerl of Washington, the indulgence may be obtained by those who “are truly penitential and compelled by charity, which indeed they can apply to the souls of the faithful held in Purgatory, by way of suffrage, if they take part in the sacred celebrations, along with the great assembly of people, throughout the whole course of the annual event that is called ‘March for Life,’ which will be carried out on the eighteenth and nineteenth days of January 2018” in the diocese of Arlington and the archdiocese of Washington.

What is an indulgence?

An indulgence is the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. In the same way that priests may forgive sins through the sacrament of penance, the Church has the authority to remit the punishment of sin outside the sacrament. While indulgences are associated with certain acts, these acts do not “earn” or “buy” forgiveness; they instead teach us that we must strive to make amends for our sins and show us the effect of good works — in this case, the noble undertaking of defending the value and dignity of each human life — in the life of God’s grace.

The conditions of the indulgence

To obtain this plenary indulgence, the faithful must not only participate in sacred celebrations held in the dioceses of Arlington or Washington during the March for Life, they must also fulfill the three usual conditions of an indulgence — sacramental Confession, Holy Communion and prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.

From the Vocations Director

James P. Weiskircher, Vocations Director

I would like to thank the Grand Knights and Faithful Navigators that responded to my emails to identify their support for seminarians for the 2017-18 year. So far, councils and assemblies have committed over \$60,000 this fiscal year to support seminarians. Usually, this information is obtained when the RSVP forms are mailed in and it is difficult to make any changes to the program. In many cases, councils are choosing their own seminarians resulting in an imbalance of support. Some seminarians have as many as 7 or 8 councils or assemblies supporting them, while others have only one or in the case of Adorno seminarians in Theology with none. We will work with the vocations department to identify the needy seminarians and develop a system to roll out at the Grand Knights meeting in July to balance out the support. With the critical shortage of priest in the diocese, we need deacons to help fill the void. We presently have several Knights across the state that are in the formation process of becoming a deacon. Please take the time to seek out a deacon to see if it might be what God is calling you to do.

The entire process takes five full years. If you have ever thought or prayed about becoming a deacon, please look at the following steps as to how one becomes a deacon in the Diocese of Charleston?

1. Pray and be open to the Holy Spirit
2. Must be a practicing Catholic and actively involved in a parish ministry for a minimum of 3 years
3. Have a dialog with your pastor
4. Applicants must possess a high school diploma or GED
5. Complete the application and assemble all required documentation
6. Mail the application and supporting documentation to: Office of the Diaconate, 1662 Ingram Rd., Charleston, SC 29407
7. Applications are reviewed by a committee
8. Initial interviews conducted by a committee; enquirers selected continue to the next step
9. Background screening, psychological testing, and Safe Environment training
10. Family visits and final interviews of enquirers and wives; those selected will enter the discernment phase
11. Formation classes meet for four years and

may be awarded an Associate Degree or work towards a Bachelor of Arts in Religion

12. Applicants who have already earned a Bachelor Degree may work toward a Master Degree in Theology by maintaining a 3.0 GPA
13. The cost varies each year and differs accordingly to the degree sought; currently 1/3 of the tuition is paid by the aspirant, 1/3 by the aspirant's parish, and 1/3 by the diocese
14. Wives are welcome and invited to attend all sessions to either audit the classes at no cost or earn their degree at their own expense.

Christ's Baptism

My brother Knights, the Christmas season has officially ended with the Feast of the Lord's Baptism this past week.
