Mass Attendance

Happy New Year! Greetings Brothers and families. As we start a new year, I would like to reiterate with you on the importance of the Mass. We all know that as Catholics, we are required to attend Holy Mass every Sunday (or the Vigil Mass on Saturday) and all Holy Days of Obligation. It is not required, but attendance at Ash Wednesday is a good idea and most of the time this service is a 'full house' affair, at least at my Parish Church. Holy Thursday and Good Friday are other important non-Holy Days that many people attend. I say, go for it.

Brothers, as Knights of Columbus, we need to be aware of Mass attendance, dress and times of the Masses. Of course, as a Deacon, I would prefer that you arrived 15-30 minutes before Mass so that you can join in on praying the Rosary with your fellow parishioners, or if no Rosary, at least you can pray to the Holy Trinity and reflect on the Scripture readings for the day. I always recommend that you read the three Scripture Readings before you come to Mass so that you have a better idea of what they are about and you might be able to understand the message that the Priest or Deacon are conveying in their homilies.

My Brothers, the Mass is not about "having fun" or being entertained. Holy Mass is a divine appointment with God, the Creator of the universe, to worship and thank Him for all

He has done for us. We do this, not because He needs it, but because we need to acknowledge God as our Father and our place in His family. (CCC 1324-1327)

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that the Liturgical celebration is basically the same since the Second Century. Did you know that together, the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist form a single act of worship at the Mass? The most important part of Mass, is of course, receiving Christ in the Eucharist. Mass is the source and summit of the Christian life. (CCC 1324) You can look at Mass this way, it is one very long prayer that has many parts to it. They all are connected and important.

As a Deacon, I plead with you DO NOT LEAVE MASS EARLY! So many people leave the Mass right after they have received the Body and Blood of Christ. One of my fellow parishioners told me after one of our Masses last weekend that he couldn't believe how many people leave Mass early. Please do not leave early. You need to pray and thank Jesus after communion, hear the remaining prayers of dismissal and receive the final blessing. You should stay for the closing hymn and wait for the Priest, Deacon and Altar Servers to process out of the Church before you leave. That is Respect. Viva Cristo Rey!

2020 is a historic year for the Patriotic degree of the Knights of Columbus.

It was 1899, the world was in turmoil and it looked like war might be imminent. America would soon be drawn across the ocean for a war to end all wars. Catholic sentiment was at an all-time low, we were being persecuted in Mexico, the Klan was waging all out war against the Church and Catholic schools. In our own country, the feeling was that Catholic men would not raise up against the tyranny of mostly Catholic regimes in Germany and Italy. The problems seemed overwhelming; but wherever there are insurmountable odds, when the times seem the darkest, the barely seventeen-yearold Order of Catholic men had a solution. On Washington's birthday, February 22, 1900, the Patriotic degree of the Order was introduced. Honor, Country, God and Duty are every bit as important to Sir Knights today as to any other American -maybe even more so!

Next month we will celebrate 120 years of Catholic leadership in Charity, Unity, Fraternity and **Patriotism**.



Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

Correspondence

With Council and Assembly installations coming up the following is provided as guidance for you to follow.

When corresponding with others, email id the most effective and efficient means of communication. However, e-mail may not be the most appropriate means of communication in all circumstances. Sometimes typed memos or letters, on letterhead, should be utilized and care should be taken to ensure that the letter writer uses proper letter writing techniques.

E-mails also need to be handled with care. Officers need to make certain that their e-mail address is appropriate along with the content contained within the e-mail. Sending an e-mail does not ensure delivery to the intended recipient. E-mail is cost effective and can be an easy way for councils or assemblies to communicate, but it is not a guarantee of participation at an event. E-mail, as with letters, need to be clearly stated and have the main points separated. Make certain that e-mails that contain confidential information are not broadcast to a large group. E-mails cannot replace the personal contact of a phone call or personal conversation.

Modern means of social communications provide members of the Knights of Columbus with powerful tools that can build up your council by promoting its charitable mission and by encouraging members to live out their Catholic faith. The term "social communications" refers to, among other things, the internet, the World Wide Web, and social media. The term "social media" includes blogs and microblogs, social networking sites, and picture and video sharing sites, such as Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn, Flickr, and YouTube.

Social communications should be used in a manner consistent with Catholic values and principles of the Order. Members who use social communications should carefully review and at all times observe the Order's Social Communications Guidelines and Policy, which can be found under the Social Communications tab on the Officer's Desk Reference located in the Officer's Online at www.kofc.org. The Guidelines and Policy apply to members and subordinate units of the Order when they choose to identify themselves as members of the Knights of Columbus or to discuss the work of the Knights of Columbus using social communications. Members should be aware that the Laws and official policies of the Knights of Columbus apply to fraternal social communications as they would in any other setting. The reputation of the Order depends upon how members conduct themselves, both online and in person. Accordingly, members using social commu-

nications should remember that they are expected to conduct themselves as Catholic gentlemen, which at a minimum requires that any material posted online respect human dignity and maintains a culture of respectful dialogue and friendship. Correspondence should be addressed to the individual, using his full, proper name (not his nickname), followed by his proper title, whether he be a Knight of Columbus, a Priest or a businessperson. If an individual has more than one title, the highest ranking title is always used. Names of civic and religious individuals are prefixed by such forms as His Excellency, The Honorable, Reverend Father, etc. Prefix titles of Mr., and Mrs. or Ms. Are omitted when the individual has another official title. If he has no title, Mr., Mrs., or Ms. Should always be used as a prefix to his or her name. When addressing an individual as an official of an organization, the name of the organization should always be shown on the next line.

In the event that you have a close working relationship with any officer, your letter need not be so formal. However you first must acknowledge the office he holds. The salutation would then be "Worthy Grand Knight and dear Brother Bill." The individual's full proper name and title are always shown on both the letter and the envelope.

How are we doing with membership in South Carolina? Not bad. We have a quota of 501 members for the year and, to

date, we have brought in 193 members. But, more importantly, how is your council doing with membership? There are plenty of fish in the ocean and all you have to do is "go fishing". Easier said than done? Not really. Schedule a Membership Drive in your parish on a regular basis and I guarantee your "nets" will gather some fish. You may not get immediate results but, persistence will pay off.

Become more visible in your parish. Try to run parish activities so that almost every week of the month there is a bulletin article or Mass announcement that starts out with "Members of the Knights of Columbus are". Have all your members wear the emblem of the order when attending Mass. It's like the Geico commercials. If you watch TV, I'm sure you see 2 or 3 Geico commercials every day. I'm sure it pays off for them or else they wouldn't be doing it. Make your council and the Knights of Columbus visible in your church and, it will eventually yield results.

a better Catholic ... a better man. All in a one day event.


