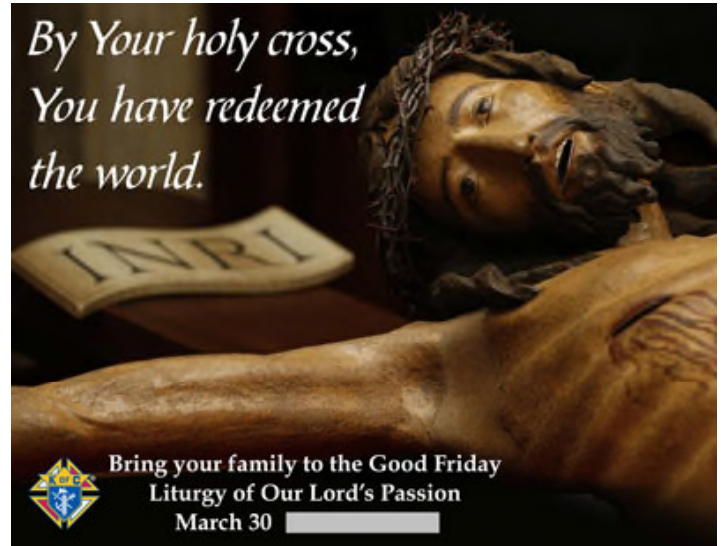
Unfortunately, attendance at the Good Friday Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death has been in decline in many parts of our country.

In our busy lives, it is all too easy to look away from the harsh reality that Christ bore on the Cross for us. However, our faith and that of our families and parishes are strengthened when we take the time to attend the Good Friday liturgy.

As Archbishop Fulton Sheen put it: "Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday."

As we enter the Lenten season, every council is asked to encourage brother Knights and their families to attend the Good Friday liturgy in their parish on March 30. Let your parishes know of the liturgy's importance and how its commemoration can strengthen each family as a domestic church. Here are some things your council can do to promote attendance at the Good Friday liturgy:

- Display the "By Your Holy Cross" poster around your council meeting place, in the church vestibule (with the pastor's permission) and at other gathering spots around the parish.
- A digital 8.5x11 version of the poster is also available in PDF format. This may be downloaded and distributed after Palm Sunday Mass or used as an insert in your parish bulletin. Be sure to fill in the time for your parish's liturgy in



the available space provided on the PDF.

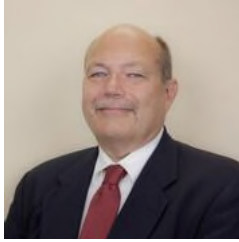

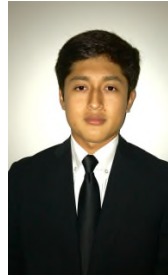

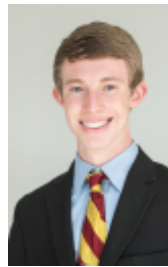

Dear Brothers,

I cannot think of a more exciting adventure book to read this Lenten season than that of the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska.



She was a beautiful saint from Poland who was born in 1905 and was privileged to be visited by Jesus for many years. He had one of the most important messages of modern time to convey to Sister Faustina. He wanted her to tell the world about the unfathomable Mercy of God the Father which is available to each of us,

just for the asking. Jesus' messages are recorded in her diary (which has been endorsed by the Magisterium). <http://www.shopmercy.org/Diary-of-Saint-Maria-Faustina-Kowalska/NBFD/itm/07110053/TDM-NEWS>

We can have this Divine Mercy by complying with His request in the manner with which He asked for it. THAT IS ALL!!! My brother Knights of Columbus.....I want to pass on to you this Divine gift. I want you and your families to receive this gift (which has been acknowledged and affirmed by the Magisterium of the Catholic Church). The Feast of The Divine Mercy is celebrated on the Sunday following Easter. Let me convey to you what Jesus gave to each of us just for the asking. On the Sunday following Easter, Jesus wants us to go to Confession, Mass, Communion and say the Divine Mercy Chaplet using the beads of our rosary. In addition, we are to extend an act of forgiveness towards someone.

The Lord Jesus told her: *I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy (Diary 299). I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender Mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy*



*Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened (Diary 699).*

Here is how to say the Divine Mercy Chaplet: Using your rosary, say an Our Father, Hail Mary & I Believe. Then on the large beads say, "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son our Lord, Jesus Christ....In atonement for my sins and those of the whole world." Then, on each of the 10 small beads say, "For the sake of His sorrowful passion...Have mercy on us and on the whole world." After 5 decades of this litany, say 3 times,

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One....have mercy on us and on the whole world." Jesus I Trust In You.

My brothers, what a beautiful way to wrap up the Easter season!

## From the Retention Chairman

*Joe Balotti*

As your State Council Retention Chairman, I understand your desire to maintain your Council's Membership Roster as accurately as possible assuring each member is a contributing Knight of Columbus. I also understand that financial hardship should never be a reason that prevents that Catholic Gentlemen from being a contributing Knight of Columbus. However, when a Knight of Columbus is no longer a contributing member to the council in any way, it may become time to consider requesting a withdrawal from him or begin the clearly defined retention process. Please note, your State Council will not stop your suspension attempts as long as the clearly written guidelines are followed.

To review those steps, please allow me to summarize them as follows: (I realize there are terminology differences between Supreme's online system and the F. S. handbook.)

1. The Membership bill-1<sup>st</sup> Notice will be sent 15 days prior to the billing period.
2. If payment is not received within 30 days, the Membership bill-2<sup>nd</sup> Notice will be sent.
3. If payment is still not received 30 days from the date the 2<sup>nd</sup> notice was sent, the Financial Secretary will:
  - a. Provide the Retention Committee the names, addresses, telephone number and amount of delinquency of each member that is delinquent.
  - b. A "Knight Alert" letter will be sent to each delinquent member.
4. Someone from the Retention Committee will make personal contact with the delinquent member to remind him of his obligation. A written report will be given to the Grand Knight with the details of that contact.
5. If a Notice of Intent to Retain (Suspend) is generated, a copy goes to your District Deputy who will phone the member. Most of the Notice of Intent to Retain forms have been incomplete when they get to Supreme. Most are missing the retention committeeman information. Any incomplete forms will be rejected by Supreme.

I appreciate this is quite a list, but remember, you are talking about suspending a Knight of Columbus. Thank you in advance for your attention to the details.
