Ordering 4th Degree Uniform

As demand for new 4th Degree uniforms continues, order being accepted.

Due to the continuing number of orders coming in for the new Fourth Degree Uniform, we are again extending the deadline for the 25 percent discount on ordering the new uniform to Nov. 30, 2017.



Demand for the new Fourth Degree uniform has far outpaced inventory and production capability of our manufacturer. To date more than 8,000 uniforms have been sold.

We also continue to work toward ways to increase the production. We want you to have the new uniform quickly, but without sacrificing quality. Current projections have orders

Brothers,

Membership in our Order is quite different from membership in any other organization. We are not just a civic group dedicated to Charity, although Charity is the first principle of the Order. It is also the very fundamental principle of our faith. In just the last few weeks we've all watched with horror the massacres in Las Vegas and Texas. We have also seen what the face of Jesus looks like in the many stories we've seen and heard from those who saved lives by risking and sacrificing their own.

In the aftermath of Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, Maria and possibly others before the season is over, the Knights of Columbus are there providing for those in need. Those councils and Knights who cannot be there are providing millions of dollars in charitable and manpower contributions to the victims of the devastation.

On a global scale, our Order continues to provide support to persecuted Christians in the Middle East--over \$13 million so far. I am proud that our councils and Knights in South Carolina not only support all these global-wide initiatives; but also directly serve those in need in our parishes and communities through our many local programs.

Our Order and councils provide tremendous opportunities for men and their families to grow in their Catholic faith through the many Church related programs like Building the Domestic Church. Why, then, would we not extend an invitation to other Catholic men to join us?

As we enter the second quarter of the year, I'm asking all fraternal leaders to make the adjustments necessary to attract and to recruit new members into our councils and to involve the older members to be more active. If you are struggling a bit, your district deputy and field agent can assist. I am challenging every Knight in every council, to ask one Catholic man in your parish to become a Knight this month. From the Vocations Director

James P. Weiskircher, Vocations Director

In my first meeting with Bishop Guglielmone over 8 years ago, I asked him what do you do if you believe that your son might have a vocation. He had said that you need to continue to provide opportunities for him to grow in his faith. My wife and I have tried to provide every opportunity to learn more of his vocation.

Over four years ago, my son Ben joined the Adorno Fathers as a seminarian. He had done his first three years at The Catholic University in Washington, so upon becoming a seminarian he completed his final year of Theology at Seton Hall. He has been in the Philippines for the past 3 years doing his postulancy and novitiate.

Ten years ago, when Ben had turned 18 and still in high school, he came to me and said that I had made him stay in scouting and get his Eagle rank and this was the best thing that could have happened to him. But at 18, he wanted me to join the Knights of Columbus with him. Over the next 6 months, we did first, second, third and fourth degrees together.

On October 31st, Ben did his simple profession to the Clerics Regular Minor, or Adorno Fathers, at Jesus Our Risen Savior in Spartanburg. Even though the Adorno Fathers have been in South Carolina for almost thirty years, this is the first time that a simple profession has been held in the diocese for them. The simple profession is done after your four years of college, postulancy, and novitiate. The ceremony is his vow to follow the rules of the order and to continue his pursuit of becoming a priest. His habit, rosary, and belt were blessed and he officially became Brother Ben C.R.M. This is only the first step in a process that will take approximately twelve years in total.



For many in the parish, this beautiful ceremony gave them the opportunity to learn more about the religious life. Parish priests take two vows of chastity and obedience. The Adorno

The social baldric can be worn at any social event under a tuxedo jacket or under a suit jacket.” What does this all mean:

- Proper dress for exemplification candidates:
- o Dark suits. (Tuxedos meet this requirement.)
 - o Social baldrics will be provided at the exemplification.

Proper dress for Sir Knights: (This includes attendance at exemplifications, installation of officers, banquets, and other events where Sir Knights attend without being part of the color corps.)


- o Dark suits with social baldric.
- o Tuxedos with social baldric.
- o Uniform (beret not required.)

Proper dress for Color Corps (Color Guards and Honor Guards):

- o Uniform with beret, service baldric, white gloves and sword.
- o Tuxedo with cape, chapeau, service baldric, white gloves and sword.

We have been attempting to build the Domestic Church initiative for almost one year. I need immediate feedback so that the next 12 months can be significantly more effective. Write to me and tell me what you have done so far, what you need from me, and what your Council's goals are for this year. I'm asking for 4 minutes of your time. Send me an email TODAY with the above information. Please send it with an Info Copy to your District Deputy. He needs to know what your involvement is. I'll be meeting with the District Deputies the first weekend of December and reviewing the Domestic Church Program with them. I'm here to serve you, so please write to me immediately. stclair33@bellsouth.net

Since Advent is starting the first week of December, there is just enough time to plan an Advent event for your Council and parish members. If you haven't already started the planning, you'll need to jump into high gear and push hard. Get with your Grand Knight, Chaplain and your Pastor. Review the project, "Journey to the Inn" which is provided by Supreme's Domestic Church website and consider it for one of your 4 Major Projects of the year which qualify your council for Star Council. Carefully choose a date during Advent to host the event. Be sure this date is acceptable to your pastor.
