Rome, Assisi, and Florence...along with 78 other people, including our Bishop Robert Guglielmone and Father Andrew Fryml, celebrating our Diocese's 200th. Anniversary. This was a very spiritual journey along with being an educational opportunity. A lot of prayers said every day.

We began the Pilgrimage with a four-day visit of Rome (Roma), then two days in Assisi and finishing with two days in Florence (Firenze). On the Pilgrimage, we were able to see and visit many holy places, Basilicas and Cathedrals. We also visited and observed several archeological, historical structures through out our journey. (Aqueducts, obelisks, Pantheon, Coliseum and the Catabombs, along with the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel.)

We visited St. Peter's Basilica and the Vatican...Sue and I enjoyed reserved seating to see the Pope on Wednesday when he gave his talk to the thousands of visitors in attendance about St. Stephen. We also enjoyed as a group, a private, after hours tour of the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel. A very holy, spiritual place that you just needed to sit down and absorb the ambience and beautiful artwork and PRAY.

My wife Sue was able to climb the "Holy Stairs" on her knees,

Our pilgrimage was a faith journey celebrated by 80 members of the Diocese of Charleston (including 4 Deacons), along with Bishop Guglielmone and Fr. Andrew Fryml. It was a pleasure and honor to be able to pray, meditate, go to Holy Mass and see all the beauty of Italy, past and present. Such a blessing for Sue and I to cherish the rest of our lives! "Ciao. Seminarian Will Frei celebrated his birthday on Thursday October 3rd in a very special way. He was ordained to the transitional diaconate along with 30 of his classmates at the Basilica of St. Peter at the Altar of the Chair. According to the Pontifical North American College website, "Ordination to the transitional diaconate marks the last stage in seminary formation before ordination to the priesthood. The ordination brings about a profound change in the life of the man who receives it, as he passes from the lay to the clerical state. At the ordination, the man makes a public commitment to certain promises, namely, obedience to his ordinary, maintaining a life of chaste celibacy, and being a man of prayer, specifically by praying the Liturgy of the Hours on behalf of the Church and the world. By the laying on of hands and the prayer of consecration by a bishop, a man is configured to Christ the Servant, and is charged with assisting in a new way in the Church's liturgical worship, especially by proclaiming the Gospel, preaching, and in performing works of charity."

Deacon Frei was blessed to have a large group of family and friends in attendance at the ordination. In attendance was the Most Reverend Robert E. Guglielmone, Father Matthew Gray, Vicar of Vocations, Father Gregory Wilson, his pastor, and friends Fathers Andrew Fryml, Rhett Williams, Renaurd West and Christopher Smith.

Each seminarian has an apostolate while in formation. Deacon Frei works with Mother Teresa's order, Missionaries of Charity in Rome during the year and a summer assignment in India. He was blessed to have several members of the order in attendance to witness his ordination.

Rev. Mr. Frei will be ordained in July in the diocese by Bishop Guglielmone. Please keep him in your prayers as he completes his studies in Rome.

Worthy Sir Knights,



From the State Protocol Chairman

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

GREETING YOUR GUESTS

All guests should be greeted by the Grand Knight or Faithful Navigator. The Grand Knight or Faithful Navigator should be assisted by a committee whose function would be to care for the guests' coats, to introduce them to others in attendance and to answer any questions they may have.

Guests should not be left talking among themselves. They usually do not know many of your council or assembly members, and therefore should not be left alone for any period of time. Various persons should be altered to converse with and keep company with guests during their visit (not necessarily the same person or persons for the entire visit).


INTRODUCTIONS

Many if not most introductions involve people of unequal or different status or positions. They can differ in rank, in age or in sex, but the result is the same: an introduction usually consists of presenting one person of lesser importance or status to another of greater importance or status.

In introducing a group of people to an individual, avoid running through all the names without a break. It is better to introduce two or three people at a time, so that names can register properly. This is where use of name tags is most effective.

A form of acknowledgement used chiefly when meeting a group is repeating the name of the person to whom you have just been introduced.

Before introducing dignitaries at the head table, be certain names are spelled correctly and proper titles are used. It is a good idea to check the pronunciations of any names to be announced. The order of rank should be observed meticulously. A person who has been elected but has not yet taken office is called by the title of the office with – "elect" after the title. A Monsignor is not addressed as "Father" and a state officer is not addressed as "Brother." Remember, if you don't announce the name and title to the gathering, how can they be expected to know who the person is?







Dear Brother Knights,

For the past several years, we have been emphasizing the process of individual holiness and the importance of prayer. Without prayer, there will not be holiness. If this is the case, we can be assured that our daily decisions are not centered on what God wants for us....we will be making personal choices based upon what "We" want for "Ourselves". In the same vein, if our personal spiritual growth is lacking effort, then it is also a good bet that we may not be leading our family in God's Way.

Why all the emphasis on holiness, prayer and spiritual growth? The simple answer is that these are the basic building blocks that we have for our earthly journey on the way to heaven. So now I have identified the BEGINNING and the GOAL in our game of LIFE. What lies in between? Well, as most of us have encountered, the short answer is: choices, problems, successes, disappointments, happiness, joy, and peace. The list is endless. One of our greatest treasures that we have at our disposal to help each of us make good choices is the guidance that Jesus provided while He walked this earth 2000 years ago. That guidance is contained in the bible. Another tool given to us is The Church that Jesus established for the purpose of providing all of us with sound guidance as we progress in our earthly journey. We have the Tradition of the Faith and we have the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Jesus promised us that He would always be with us and with His Church until the end of time. He did not promise us smooth waters, but we are assured that His grace, His love, the Holy Spirit, and His peace will help us navigate troubled waters.

My fellow Knights! Stormy seas are raging. Satan is attacking us from all directions. He has focused on destroying the family unit, our children, our sense of honesty and truth, and our civility with our neighbor. We read and hear of failures by some of our priests, bishops and cardinals. We begin to doubt the legitimacy of the Catholic Church. We blow off confession. We become cynical about practicing our Catholic faith in a passionate way. We see many of our elected representatives in Washington DC lying, cheating, and conniving on a daily basis. Perhaps in recent months and days you have been hearing of turmoil in Rome. Conflicting stories about the rightness and wrongness of key issues and policies of the Church are circulating. This month, the Amazon Synod has been convened. A few years ago a Family Synod was held. Papal Encyclicals have been issued, most famously, Amoris

Laetitia (The Joy of Love). It is an apostolic exhortation by Pope Francis addressing the pastoral care of families, dated 19 March 2016.

Does right or wrong change? Do the Doctrines of our Faith as proclaimed by the Magisterium of the Catholic Church change with time? Can the Magisterium of today declare null and void, the Doctrines established hundreds of years earlier? Can correct behavior (orthropraxis) be separated from correct belief (orthrodox teaching)? Of course not!



The Faith is under attack by Satan and as Knights we should care enough to respond to the attack. We do not turn and run away. Abandonment is never, ever a choice by a Knight of Columbus. We are defenders of the Faith. But always remember, that in

order to properly defend, we must be knowledgeable of the Faith, of the issues, the attacks, the false teachings, the deceptive excuses given, and the false accusations.

For the immediate future, let us all study up on what is happening around the Church. Pray much. Pray the rosary. Go to Eucharistic Adoration and listen to God. Then, approach your Council Chaplin or your Pastor and encourage him to immediately address these issues that may have the parishioners confused and frustrated. Do not allow your own frustrations or disgust to cause you to leave the Catholic Church. You are a Knight. We don't run away. Work diligently in your Council, your family, and in your parish to lead the charge in defense of Truth, love, and loyalty. Stand firm. Protect your priests. Protect the Church.

Let us, as faithful Knights, make a difference. Keep chargin'!




