From the Vocations Director

I was hoping to have all of the names and parishes of the new seminarians so that you would know who from your parish that you should sponsor. The Office of Vocations has yet to update their web site and contact list. As soon as I get the list, I will send an email to each of the councils that have a new seminarian from their parish with the hopes that his home council will sponsor him. Bishop Guglielmone has asked if a seminarian is from your parish that you sponsor him. This helps to bring the parish together in prayers and financial support for the young man. It is important that they have a strong support base encouraging them to continue their studies.

If you are looking for a new seminarian to sponsor, please email me and I will get you the name of a deserving candidate. With 10 new seminarians, we want to make sure that everyone has at least one council supporting them. Guys that have have been in the program for more than two years in many cases have multiple councils sponsoring them. In Andrew Fryml and Rhett Williams cases they had 6 sponsoring councils, with most of them just having one council sponsoring them, or in the new seminarian's cases, no one sponsoring them yet. As you are establishing your budgets for this year, please consider sponsoring a seminarian if you have not done so in the past. If you have sponsored one, please consider sponsoring a second one in the coming year. I will be able to make a recommendation so that we can make sure that one seminarian does not receive all of the support while the others go without any. If a young man is from your parish or has worked in the parish over the summer please support them. The Councils in South Carolina have been very generous in the past and I am hoping that you will continue again this year. This year, we have ten young men entering the seminary. We need to make sure that each of them is covered.

Remember that all seminarians need support. If you are in the Rock Hill area, and your priests come from the Oratory, then please consider supporting a seminarian from there. If your parish is covered by an Order like the Adorno Fathers or Franciscan's, please consider supporting a seminarian from their Order. They need our support and prayers as much as our diocesan seminarians do.

Our seminarians are starting back to school and if they are going to a new seminary, their addresses and email addresses will be changing. Several of our seminarians are going to St. Mary's Seminary in Houston. Our prayers go out to them and I hope that the seminary was spared the flooding.

Last year, our council decided to participate in the Keep Christ in Christmas, Christmas card and car magnet program. We purchased the kit and took orders after Mass for

Brother Sir Knights,

I attended a meeting with the Vice Supreme Master Bob Anderson and all the Masters of

the De Soto Province this weekend where the new uniform was discussed. Here are the exact word [with my edits for brevity] to the amended "Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus."

"Section 40 (a) The official regalia when serving in a Color Corps (Honor Guard or Color Guard) is the same as the official dress of a member [i.e. the new uniform] or a black tie, plain white tuxedo shirt, black cummerbund, black socks, plain black shoes, black tuxedo ... with the following additions:[cape, chapeaux, white gloves, and sword.]"

This is the best and most current information of the requirements. I know the Supreme website states that after June 30, 2018, "only the new uniform should be worn." What this means and how it will be implemented, I do not know. I do know that true Sir Knights hold unwaveringly to what is right and honorable and will continue to serve the Church and keep God in the civic arena.

The fact is that the new uniform is here and it is here to stay. I encourage any Sir Knight who is considering the new uniform to order it before the end of September 2017, while Supreme is offering a 25% discount. Order from www.knightgear.com. The 75th South Carolina District Exemplification is scheduled for September 30 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Charleston. Time is short to recruit new Fourth Degree members. Candidates shall wear a black or dark (blue or grey) business suit with black socks with black shoes, white dress shirt and tie. Tux meets this requirement. Sports coats and slacks are not allowed. I encourage all Sir Knights to come and wear their regalia.

We need all councils to get active and hold Admission Degrees often and bring in new life blood to the Knights of Columbus. Ask your Council what it will take to add new members to help do the work of Charity, Unity and Fraternity. If your Council needs help your District Deputy is only a phone call away.

Several have asked how they can get the new Carolingian Crucifixes that are being given to new Formation Degree members; they can be ordered from Supreme Council by your council by using its item number 30635. They would make a good gift to Knight or Family of the Month.

The attached reports show the status of each council for Admission Degrees and the District Formation Degrees for 2017 – 2018. These reports do not show membership intake for councils or District. They only show either Admission or Formation Degrees held.

PROTOCOL

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

Dress for Meetings and Degrees

The presiding officer, in keeping with the dignity of his office, should be neatly and properly dressed. He should request that his officers do likewise to set the proper dress code for the membership to follow. Proper dress for this and all degrees is coat and tie. Remember the first impression that visitors and new members (candidates) get is what they see first when coming to a function or degree. Dress for candidates should also be coat and tie for all degrees. They should be told this

Pray for your fellow Knights who are resisting or are apprehensive about such a commitment. Pray for your extended family members and for your parish family, that they, too, will see the need for a renewed spiritual life. It is the first step in building the Domestic Church and the time to move forward into parish involvement is upon us.

As I write this letter, we are undergoing a serious threat to Florida, Georgia, Alabama, and to our State of South Carolina. Hurricane Irma is a gargantuan monster. The images from Hurricane Harvey in Texas are a bitter and clear memory of devastation from just 2 weeks ago. Surely, my brothers, these two events have brought you to a state of heightened prayer which is a wonderful response to any catastrophe. I'm also sure that you have already contributed to the Knights of Columbus Charity effort to help those affected by the storm(s). Good for you. KEEP LOOKING FOR WAYS TO HELP. As I mentioned last year at the mid-winter GK workshop, my brothers, we are in a spiritual battle that is raging across the globe. Regard for life, rule of law, and common civility are all being abandoned faster than we ever thought possible just 3 years ago. These societal breakdowns are a huge threat to our Domestic Church. Brother Knights, let's take this initiative seriously and start praying individually, as a family, and as a Council. Let us all pray for our nation, our Church, and our families. Let us pray for all the folks who were devastated by Harvey and Irma. Finally, let us pray for the seminarian sponsored by Council 6514 of Athens, Georgia. Earlier this year he returned to Mexico where the seminary there assigned him to a remote outpost. He was subsequently accosted by banditos. They have threatened to return and take his life. He wants to return to an American seminary. Let us all pray that his VISA is approved. In next month's newsletter I'll let you know of the outcome to this prayer request.
