"Lost and Found"

Greetings my Brother Knights! Lost and found. Have you ever felt this way, "Lost and Found?" If you look at the Gospel reading from the 24th. Sunday in Ordinary Time, we have 3 "lost and found" parables. Luke's Gospel is concerned about the agony of loss and the joy of being found. We have the lost coin, the lost sheep, and the lost son.

With sinners and tax collectors crowding closer and closer to

listen to Jesus, all the while the scribes and Pharisees were clustered together complaining, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So, Jesus used the "lost and found" parables as a teaching tool to inform them on the boundlessness of God's mercy, along with reconciliation and forgiveness. The Prodigal Son is probably the most known and beloved story by Jesus. This story is a reflection on all of us. Maybe you, my Brothers, can identify with the son who got his inheritance and left his father in favor of audacious living. Or can you identify with the eldest son? He definitely showed his envy and disgruntlement when his father lovingly welcomed his "lost" brother back home! Or perhaps you connect with both sons!

The whole purpose of this story concerns reconciliation and forgiveness.

As the "lost" son said, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son." Reconciliation. The father welcomes him back with love and forgiveness. The eldest brother rejected his younger brother's

Normally, between the third year and fourth year of Theology, our seminarians are ordained to the transitional diaconate in May or June in the diocese. For the young men attending the Pontifical North American College, as a class they are ordained at St. Peters in Rome when they return for their final year. Will Frei has been in Rome for three years and will be ordained on Thursday October 3rd.

I had the opportunity to tour the PNAC last week and was amazed at what a beautiful facility it is and what an incredible formation experience it

is for anyone that attends. Rome is such an incredible place to study and grow in your faith. Each seminarian volunteers at a local charity and Will volunteers with the Missionaries of Charity in Rome.

From their web site, "In 1884, the North American College was granted pontifical status placing it under the special patronage of the Apostolic See and the care of the Holy Father. The College, therefore, is the direct concern of the Congregation for the Clergy and is under the immediate supervision of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Its Board of Governors is composed of one elected bishop from each of the fifteen episcopal regions of the United States . The priestly formation program of the College is governed by the principles and directives enunciated in the documents Optatam totius of the Second Vatican Council, Ratio Fundamentalis institutionis sacerdotalis of the Congregation for Catholic Education, the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation Pastores dabo vobis of His Holiness Saint John Paul II, and the Program of Priestly Formation of the Bishops of the United States.

The seminary community is currently composed of students sponsored by dioceses from across the United States and Australia who devote themselves to personal formation for priestly ministry under the attentive guidance, supervision and evaluation of a formation faculty of priests and religious. In this house of formation, seminarians deepen their awareness of the meaning and challenges of priesthood through their theological studies, through prayerful reflection on the revealed Word of God and the Tradition of the Church and its meaning for the modern world, as well as through a variety of pastoral service opportunities.

Until the outbreak of the Second World War all the college's students resided at the old campus in the heart of the city. During the war, the various national seminaries in Rome were

From the State Protocol Chairman

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

STATE DEPUTY OR HIGH RANKING OFFICER VISIT

When the State Deputy, District Master or other high ranking officer is scheduled to attend a council or assembly function, always be sure that he is advised of the date, time, place, purpose, type of affair, and other individuals on the program – including their function, and other pertinent data.

If women are to be present, the State Deputy's wife should be invited. Advise her of the appropriate dress for the occasion and arrange for a ladies' committee to greet and welcome her. Always advise the State Deputy and head table guests of the proper dress for the affair.

Offer to arrange hotel facilities for the State Deputy or inform the State Deputy or guest of the most convenient hotel accommodations. Determine his time of arrival and arrange to greet him. If the affair is not a banquet, arrange for someone to offer to take the State Deputy or high-ranking officer to dinner. Arrangements also should be made for travel to the site of the affair and return to the hotel.

On arrival at the site of the affair, the Grand Knight or faithful Navigator and his committee should again greet the high-ranking officer. He should be properly introduced to the other dignitaries in attendance.

In recognition of his high office, special appreciation should always be expressed to him for his visit to the function. Arrange proper speaking facilities, including podium, podium light and microphone.

The State Deputy is the highest elected official in the jurisdiction and proper attention must be given to seating arrangements. Other high ranking officers need to be seated according to protocol.

If there is additional entertainment after the banquet, a special table for the high-ranking officers should be arranged so that they will be with the Grand Knight or faithful Navigator and other dignitaries.

The master of ceremonies should be provided with a resume of the State Deputy and other head table guests so that he can make proper introductions. If glossy photographs are required for publicity purposes, they should be requested directly from the guest.

If some other high-ranking official, not a Knight of Columbus member or member of a different council, is invited to attend a Council or Assembly function, the sponsoring organization should extend the same courtesies as those suggested for use of the State Deputy and other head table guests so that he can make proper introductions.



Until the outbreak of the Second World War all the college's students resided at the old campus in the heart of the city. During the war, the various national seminaries in Rome were temporarily closed by Pope Pius XII and non-Italian students returned to their home countries. When the war ended and the seminaries re-opened, the Catholic Church of the United States had experienced such an increase in vocations to the priesthood that the old campus could no longer accommodate the many seminarians whom United States bishops wanted to send to Rome for their priestly formation and university studies. To respond to that situation, the Roman Catholic bishops of the United States authorized construction of a new seminary complex on the Janiculum Hill overlooking the Vatican. The complex was built on the grounds of Villa Gabrielli al Gianicolo land the bishops had purchased in 1926. Pope Pius XII dedicated the newly built seminary complex on 14 October 1953. The Casa Santa Maria then became a residence for ordained American Catholic priests pursuing advanced studies in Rome. In 2009 and 2010, a historic eighteenth-century residence on the Janiculum Hill campus was renovated to provide a new home, the Casa O'Toole, for the college's Institute for Continuing Theological Education, a continuing formation program for priests ordained ten years or more. In addition, a new convent was built for the religious sisters who make up part of the college's staff. In January 2015 the college opened a newly constructed tower on the main Janiculum Hill building. The new construction houses classrooms, gathering space, liturgical practice chapels, and administrative offices.


