and Community, along with Fraternal Commitments: visits to the sick; visits to the bereaved; number blood donations; hours of Fraternal Service to the sick/disabled and members of their families. Get involved in your Council's 'tootsie roll' drive, too!

May I boldly suggest that you contact the KofC Insurance Agent that is assigned to your Council or talk to him when he attends your monthly meeting. Let him help you upgrade your insurance policies, your annuities or long-term care. Not many people want to talk about death, but it is a cold, hard, fact of life. # From the State Protocol Chairman

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

### **Councils and Assembly Meetings**

The Grand Knight and Faithful Navigator must conduct their meetings in accordance with the Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus, supplemented by your Councils or Assembly's by-laws and according to parliamentary procedure. The standard reference on the subject of procedure is Robert's Rules of Order. The order of business for conducting a Council or Assembly meeting is outlined in *The Method of Conducting Council Meetings* (#10318) and *The Method of Conducting Assembly Meetings* (#10325), both available from "knightsgear.com." Presiding officers should control all meetings so that they follow the set agenda by limiting any sidebar discussion.

When a member wishes to speak, he does so by rising from his seat, addressing the chair by saying "Worthy Grand Knight" or Worthy Faithful Navigator" and renders the salute. (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically opened hand, from top to bottom). The presiding officer recognizes the speaker by announcing his name and rendering the salute in return. (Representing the arms of the Cross, the presiding officer makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right).

The presiding officer should at all times refer to and address the offices by their proper title. He is thus setting a good example for all members to follow.

All members who are not officers should be recognized by name as "Brother \_\_\_\_\_" or "Sir Knight \_\_\_\_\_" All questions or comments must be directed to the chair (the presiding officer), for example: "Worthy Grand Knight or Worthy Faithful Navigator may I ask the previous speaker to explain....."

The presiding officer always speaks in the third person such as "The chair rules that ..." or Your Grand Knight or Faithful Navigator reports that ....."

Members should speak of the chair in the third person: "Worthy Grand Knight or Worthy Faithful Navigator will the chair please explain the effect of the pending motion?"

Please get this done and let your family know your wishes, that you want a Wake Service, a Funeral Mass in Church (if possible) or at least a Funeral Service Outside of Mass that a Deacon can celebrate! Yes, there is a lot to doing this, but you are special, and your spouse/family are special too. I know of too many Catholics that have died, their children have left the Church and these children do not allow a rosary to be prayed at the funeral home, a wake service or even a funeral Mass for their parent(s). It is best to be prepared and you can have peace of mind knowing your family is taken care of (insurance) and your soul is taken care of. God bless!

For 139 years, the Knights of Columbus has continued to grow both internationally and within our State. From our humble beginning dating back to the Spanish American War with only one member, the Rev Charles D Wood, to the establishment of our first council in 1902, to the creation of the State Council of the Carolinas in 1911, to the Supreme Board of Directors voting to allow both North and South Carolina to form their own State Council on June 27, 1921, we have continued to grow. After a century of service, the South Carolina State Council has roughly 9,800 knights in 64 councils. However, while this is impressive there is much more work that needs to be done.

St John Paul II stated in his address to the Supreme Council that the Church today feels a particular urgency to emphasize the vocation and mission of the laity. How true his words are today, as the "Knights of Columbus are an excellent example of the contribution which the laity can make by working together". However, in order for us to build upon the solid foundation that past generations of knights within our state have built, we must inspire other men to begin their journey as a Knight of Columbus.

Last month, I stated that with the revised guidelines for the Star Council award all councils within the state are still eligible to achieve this high distinction. Yes, that holds true today even with only 45 days left in the fraternal year. It is our hope that you leave a legacy that your council will remember for years to come. As fraternal leaders, we must always remember that the inspiration to continue moving forward begins with each one of us.

May our founder, and brother, the Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us!
