Our year is flying by at a very rapid pace. It is very inspiring for me to see those Grand Knights reports coming in with your council's accomplishments so far this year.

Every council is doing a great job. Let me thanks you for all your hard work. At our upcoming South Carolina State 95th Convention I would like to have the time to tell every one of your accomplishments. I will have only enough time to hit the highlights. It is staggering what a little state like South Carolina can do and all we do for Charity.

Recently, I sent each of our Grand Knights a special request asking you and your councils (every member) to put forth an extra effort to help the state gain enough members to gain the landmark of 10,000 members. We are now only about 150 members away. This will be a record never before met in our State. Not only will it be historical for us, but it will give the state one additional delegate to the Supreme Convention. Currently we have a resolution in for the Convention for this extra delegate to be given to a Grand Knight. What an extreme honor it would be for he and his wife to attend the Supreme Convention to represent our state and your council. I am excited about your response as new members pour in. Thank you for your immediate attention to helping us gain those extra members. There is a planned large reward for the council that brings in that 10,000 member.

We would have been closer by now but the 1000 year flood last October took its toll on membership. Thank goodness our Knights were out helping those flood victims. Knights were providing labor to move furniture, help gut water soaked walls, buying humidifiers, delivering monetary cards for financial support. We cannot thank those knights, Grand Knights and District Deputies enough for all their hard work and aid to the flood victims. We also appreciate all those councils and individuals that made contribution to the State so we could help those in need. Without this we could not have helped as many as the state did.

The flood is another reason I encourage you help us recover and gain membership. You can see from the Star Award

From the Vocations Director

James P. Weiskircher, Vocations Director

Being a mission diocese, we depend heavily on the support of religious orders to help to supply the shortage of priests in the Diocese of Charleston. Roughly one-third of our priests are from religious orders. Order priest perform the same functions as our diocesan priests, but take two additional vows of poverty and humility and an extra two years in the seminary. The Clerics Regular Minor CRM, or Adorno Fathers have 5 parishes in the US, with 4 of them being in the Diocese of Charleston. The order is over 400 years old and came from Italy to help minister to an immigrant Italian church in NJ in the 40's. After Vatican II, they heeded the Pope's call for evangelization and established additional seminaries and communities in Africa, India and the Philippines. Although they only have about 85 priests worldwide, they have over 170 young men in seminaries in Africa, Rome, India, Philippines and the US. They are one of the fastest growing orders worldwide. The US/Philippines delegation has 10 active priests in parishes, and 5 working in the seminaries, supporting 2 retired priests and 35 young men in the seminaries in the US and Philippines. The average age of the priests in the order is 42 years old. The seminarians receive no support from the dioceses that they support but rely on the support of the salaries of the Order and contributions from parishioners and the Knights to meet the needs of the seminarians.

Within the next 2-2.5 years, the Diocese of Charleston will be ordaining one priest, Andrew Fryml from Jesus, Our Risen Savior in Spartanburg. The US/Philippines delegation of the Adorno Fathers will be ordaining 8. Hopefully this will allow the Adorno Fathers to support additional parishes in the diocese. Two of the young men in the seminaries are from our diocese. Raphael is from Immaculate Conception in Goose Creek and my son Ben from Jesus, Our Risen Savior in Spartanburg. Raphael and Ben are both studying in the Philippines. Being in an International Order, it is important in their formation that they understand humility and the joy of the people that they serve in third world countries.

The charism of founder St. Francis Caracciolo and the Adorno Fathers is in Eucharistic Adoration. If you visit St. Peters in Rome, you will see a statue of St. Francis Caracciolo holding a Monstrance.

Please keep Adorno Father Jonas in your prayers. On Palm Sunday, he was going to an outlying parish in the bush in the Congo to say Mass. His car was riddled with bullets from the DFLR (Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda). Father Jonas was shot 5 times, one in the spine, two in the leg, and two in arm. His driver and a passenger were also hit. He was taken to a hospital in the bush and is in critical

CELEBRATING OUR FOUNDER

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council marked the 134th anniversary of the founding of the Order at a Mass on March 29 in St. Mary's Church in New Haven, where the Knights began when Father Michael J. McGivney first gathered a group of men from the parish. Attending the Mass were relatives of Venerable Michael J. McGivney and Knights from Connecticut.

March 29 marks the day when Connecticut approved the charter of the Knights of Columbus in 1882.

Father John Paul Walker, O.P., pastor of St. Mary's Church, served as main celebrant and homilist. In his homily, he said that Father McGivney took a leadership role for the Catholic men of his day, adding "he did so boldly, clearly and emphatically. He saw the untapped potential of the men and provided leadership."

Father Walker said that Father McGivney guided them "to live for the Lord Jesus and the Church, and also led them to be outward looking, encouraging these men to live their lives for others, the most needy."

Two relatives of Father McGivney participated in the Mass. John Walshe, great grandnephew of Father McGivney, read the first reading, while the responsorial psalm was led by Robert Ransom, an employee at the Supreme Council whose wife, Margaret Ransom, is the great grandniece of Father McGivney.

After Mass, Father Walker led supreme officers to the tomb of Father McGivney located in the rear of the church, where they recited the Prayer for Canonization along with the congregation. Father McGivney was declared Venerable in 2008, when the Vatican recognized his heroic virtue. A miracle attributed to his intercession is needed for him to advance to beatification.



Directors, State Officers, District Master, Past State Deputies, District Deputies, State Directors, General Agents, Grand Knights, Council Officers. A complete list can be found in the Protocol Handbook # 1612.

For speaking programs, guests are introduced from lowest rank up to the main speaker of the occasion. A person of junior rank should never speak after someone with a higher office unless he has been selected specifically as the speaker for the occasion. Persons introduced from the audience should be ranked from the top down as opposed to speakers who appear from the lowest up.

When more than one priest is present and a speaker does not wish to mention each by name he should say: "Reverend Monsignors and Fathers." One should never use "Reverend Clergy" unless clergymen from other faiths are present. At cooperative affairs, officers of other organizations should be seated by Knights of Columbus officers of equal rank and introduced at the same time.
