Let’s go out and make 2017 an even greater year for the Glory of God.

From the Vocations Director

Some of us remember, the early 70’s when priests were plentiful. As a youth I remember younger priests being actively involved in teaching religion in high school and seeing younger priests interacting with young people and bringing them into the church. In South Carolina, in 1970 the Diocese had 44,751 Catholics or 1.7% of the population. To serve those Catholics, we had 97 diocesan priests, 59 religious priests for a total of 156. That was one priest for every 286 Catholics. In 1970 there was 0 deacons in the Diocese.

The state has been blessed with Catholics moving into the state to live and retire. In 2013, the Diocese had grown to 192,422 or 4.1% of the population. The number of diocesan priests had grown to 115 while the number of religious priests have dropped to 47 for a total of 162 priests. This works out to one priest for every 1,187 Catholics. A huge help to our priests are our Deacons whose numbers totaled 127 in 2013

The Dioceses of Raleigh and Charlotte are in a little worse position than us, with 1,501 and 1,411 Catholics per priest. When I looked at the numbers for Atlanta I was shocked to see what an incredible shortage of priests there is in the Archdiocese. In 2015, there were 1,007,000 Catholics or 14% of the population. They have 190 diocesan priests and 28 religious priests for a total of 218. This amounts to one priest for every 4,619 Catholics.

One of the parts of a bishop’s job is to recruit priests from other dioceses and religious orders. In our diocese roughly one third are diocesan priests from our diocese. One third of the diocesan priests are on loan from other diocese and one third are religious priests. In our diocese, the two largest religious orders are the monks at Mepkin Abbey and the Adorno Fathers, each with 8 priests. Bishop Guglielmo has worked extremely hard to make sure that our parishes are covered and is actively working to keep our parishes staffed. With the number of priests retiring or dying, we need to ordain 6 seminarians each year to fill the parishes with diocesan priests. Last year, we did not ordain a diocesan priest and this year we will be ordaining Deacon Andrew Fryml. The average age of our priests being ordained, has dropped to between 30-35 years old. Six years ago the average age was well over 50.

The news is not all bad. Last year, we had only 9 seminarians. This year the number doubled. We now have 18. For the Adorno Fathers, they presently have 35 seminarians with 8 to be ordained in the next two years. It is important that we make our priests feel special. An important tool that Supreme has developed is the RSVP program for seminarians. For every \$500 given to a seminarian, the council is

Worthy Grand Knights and Members of the State Council:

We are falling short of our projected goal for the mid-year. We are only at 27% or 79 of the projected 294 degrees projected for the year. Some of the Councils have been doing their part and are at or over 50% of their goal for the year, on the other hand some Councils have not held a degree this year. These Councils are withering on the vine. To achieve Star Council you need to recruit new members and hold Degrees in a timely manner.

For a Council or District to receive credit for a degree held, the District Deputy must submit a Form 450 to Supreme, State Deputy and the Ceremonial Chairman. Be sure the Degree held is clearly marked on the form along with location held and date the degree was conducted. Until this form is received by the Ceremonial Chairman, the status record will not change in the report. Any Form 450's received after the 9th of each month will not be recorded until the next month's newsletter. The attached reports show the status of each council for Admission Degrees and the District Formation Degrees for 2016 – 2017 **THESE REPORTS DO NOT SHOW MEMBERSHIP INTAKE FOR COUNCILS OR DISTRICT.**

Directors, State Officers, District Master, Past State Deputies, District Deputies, State Directors, General Agents, Grand Knights, Council Officers. A complete list can be found in the Protocol Handbook # 1612.

For speaking programs, guests are introduced from lowest rank up to the main speaker of the occasion. A person of junior rank should never speak after someone with a higher office unless he has been selected specifically as the speaker for the occasion. Persons introduced from the audience should be ranked from the top down as opposed to speakers who appear from the lowest up.

When more than one priest is present and a speaker does not wish to mention each by name he should say: "Reverend Monsignors and Fathers." One should never use "Reverend Clergy" unless clergymen from other faiths are present. At cooperative affairs, officers of other organizations should be seated by Knights of Columbus officers of equal rank and introduced at the same time.
