Welcome back to a new year that is full of expectation! Welcome back from the parties and dinners that tend to take up our time at the end of every year! Welcome back to the life of a Knight of Columbus!

Let's discuss an important aspect of Christian life, Catholic Christian life, the Seven Sacraments of the Catholic Church: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance, the Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony. My Brothers, I can't stress it enough, you as leaders of your Domestic Church are vital in educating your family, your children, your grandchildren about these sacraments! Do not rely on the CCD teacher to show your children these sacraments, you need to be able to discuss them with your children/grandchildren. Familiarize yourself once again with these sacraments of the Church and be prepared to discuss them with the younger generation. And now, I would like to discuss the Sacrament of Baptism with you.

The Christmas season has officially ended with the Feast of the Lord's Baptism. This feast commemorates the day on which Christ formally accepts His mission as the redeemer when He receives St. John the Baptist's baptism of repentance and conversion.

By His baptism, Jesus placed Himself among us, sinners. At His baptism Jesus freely humbled Himself at the hand of John the Baptist. By His baptism, Jesus dedicates Himself

to the redemption of the world. By His baptism, Jesus takes the sins of the world and buries them in the Jordan River for humanity's sake.

Since the time of early Christianity, Baptism has been the rite of initiation into the Christian community of the Church. In Baptism, the "One Spirit" makes us members of the Body of Christ and of "one another."

During the Rite of Baptism, we reject sin, renouncing those beliefs, values and choices that are opposed to Jesus. We reject sinful attitudes. We are called to reject death and accept life and dignity for everyone.

At Baptism, we embrace a unique vision and set of values: those of the community of the Church, whose values prioritize love for God, self, others, and all of creation. The rest of the community also joins in the Profession of Faith, illustrating that the community is linked across generations, space, and time.

After being baptized, we acknowledge or receive a white garment to signify that we have risen with Christ. We receive a lighted candle, which symbolizes that we are a new creation, enlightened by Christ. We are now called to carry that light into the dark world to extend the light to others.

Baptism is one of the most important Sacraments of the Church and a beautiful action of love to behold. Brothers, share this love with those who are not baptized; evangelize, evangelize!

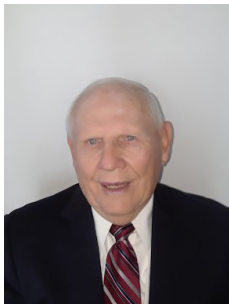

From the Vocations Director

Formation in the seminaries is key to the spirituality and human growth of future priests. It is not all about studying and class work but more of a spiritual growth and journey. Below is taken from the Vatican news of a meeting with seminarians in a question and answer format.

Pope Francis told seminarians and priests studying in Rome to care for their ongoing human and spiritual formation while being always open to the Holy Spirit. The seminarians and student priests who come from around the world for ecclesiastical studies, reside in the pontifical colleges and ecclesiastical boarding schools of the city.

The relaxed question and answer session in which the Pope responded to 5 questions from the audience, was punctuated with jokes, laughter and cheer. Responding to a French seminarian who wanted to know about how a priest could be a humble disciple and missionary at the same time, the Pope said that a priest must be a man who is on the move, who listens and who is never alone. He must be humble enough to be accompanied.

To a question from a Sudanese seminarian about how to keep discerning one's vocation even after ordination, the Pope underscored the importance of discernment saying it helps us to go ahead by making us understand what is right and what not. For an effective discernment, the Holy Father said one needs to do it before God in prayer, and secondly one needs a spiritual guide who will offer him guidelines. Without discernment, the Pope said, a priest's life stalls, becoming rigid and legalistic. One closes oneself to the Holy Spirit, who actually should be our companion on our journey. It's no use being good and live as if the Holy Spirit did not exist.


To a question from a Latin American on how to maintain a healthy balance, the Pope underscored the importance of human formation. One needs to be a normal human person, capable of enjoying others' company, laughing and listening to a sick person or consoling him with a caress. A priest has to be a father and be fruitful, giving life to others. A priest, he warned is not an official of the sacred or an employee of God. A US deacon asked the Pope about the spiritual traits of a diocesan priest and how they are practiced in daily pastoral work. In answer, the Pope used the expression "dioceness", which he explained as caring to maintain relationship with the bishop, even if he were a difficult person, and also maintaining one's relationship with brother priests and parishioners. Maintaining these three fronts, he said, will make you saints.

Regarding a Filipino priest's query on a priest's per-

From the State Protocol Chairman

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

Protocol

By definition, protocol is a system of rules that explain the correct conduct and procedures to be followed in formal situations. We can add further that it covers anything that is proper and in good taste.

While it's Impossible to cite every rule governing all situations, by applying formal courtesy you will never go wrong in those situations not covered in the Protocol booklet.

We should always display proper consideration for the office represented by the person. In no way should we let dislike for a person influence our respect for the office he holds.

Councils and Assembly Meetings

The Grand Knight and Faithful Navigator must conduct their meetings in accordance with the Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus, supplemented by your Councils or Assembly's by-laws and according to parliamentary procedure. The standard reference on the subject of procedure is Robert's Rules of Order. The order of business for conducting a Council or Assembly meeting is outlined in *The Method of Conducting Council Meetings* (#10318) and *The Method of Conducting Assembly Meetings* (#10325), both available from "knightsgear.com." Presiding officers should control all meetings so that they follow the set agenda by limiting any sidebar discussion.

When a member wishes to speak, he does so by rising from his seat, addressing the chair by saying "Worthy Grand Knight" or *Worthy Faithful Navigator*" and renders the salute. (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically opened hand, from top to bottom). The presiding officer recognizes the speaker by announcing his name and rendering the salute in return. (Representing the arm of the Cross, the presiding officer makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right).

The presiding officer should at all times refer to and address the offices by their proper title. He is thus setting a good example for all members to follow.

All members who are not officers should be recognized by name as "Brother _____" or "Sir Knight _____" All questions or comments must be directed to the chair (the presiding officer), for example: "Worthy Grand Knight or Worthy Faithful Navigator may I ask the previous speaker to explain....."

The presiding officer always speaks in the third person such as "The chair rules that ..." or Your Grand Knight or Faithful

Navigator reports that

Members should speak of the chair in the third person: "Worthy Grand Knight or Worthy Faithful Navigator will the chair please explain the effect of the pending motion?"

Faith in Action is a program designed to not only bring Faith into our families lives, it is a program that helps bring new and younger members into our lives. Do not sit on the sidelines and watch the Strong Right Hand of the Church dwindle to a nonexistent element. Do something about it. Hold a Church membership drive and encourage the men of your Church to join your Council. Don't let the parade pass you by, act now.

manent formation, the Pope recommended priests to form themselves along human, pastoral, spiritual, communitarian lines. The need for permanent formation, the Holy Father pointed out, is born of the awareness of one's weakness and limitations. Immersed in the contemporary culture, one needs to ask oneself how to live in virtual communication, how to use the mobile phone and how to face temptations against chastity that follow. One has to watch out against pride and the attraction of money, power and comfort, the Pope added.


