Brothers,

One of the serious problems that Catholic men have is our stubborn and naturally inbred individualism. We grow up thinking that we do the Christianity thing best when we do it alone, without interference and without traditions. We gather with others for Mass on Sundays, sometimes join a prayer group or occasionally help out in a mission project for the Church. But for really serious matters, we insist on taking things in regard to God and our souls into our own hands (not unlike stopping at a gas station for directions). This is despite the frequent and unqualified revelation of Scripture and church experience that we are, each of us, a member of the Body of Christ, that we are relational beings to the core, that our highest calling is to receive and give love; transactions that require relationship with others. It makes perfect theological sense for men to become Knights in a time when our spirituality in this country is at an all-time low, at a time when we need for God to bless America more than ever and a time when the poor and disabled need our help the most. However, men will never join any organization if they are not invited and made to feel welcome. Please save a soul today, ask one man to take the Spiritual journey of a lifetime with you and become a Knight of Columbus.

From the Vocations Director

On Friday night, June 9th, the Cathedral was packed to overflowing to celebrate the ordination of Deacon Andrew Fryml. On the altar were Bishop Guglielmone, 42 priests and 18 seminarians. The fourth degree, Knights of the Holy Sepulchre, and the Ladies Ancient Hibernians were all present to celebrate his ordination.

Last month, Bishop Guglielmone ordained Rhett Williams to be a transitional deacon. Deacon Rhett was on the altar along with several other deacons. If you have never attended an ordination, I would strongly encourage you to do so.

The Bishop was so proud of the growth of the seminarian program. He announced that next year, there will be 26 in the program. One has dropped out of the program and ten more will be entering in the fall. It will be very important that each one of these seminarians are supported next year. Father Andrew's first Mass of Thanksgiving was held in his home parish of Jesus, Our Risen Savior in Spartanburg on Sunday, June 11. The church was packed to capacity. He had been supported by Council 9575, since he became a member 7 years ago. The Fourth degree were on hand to celebrate with Father Fryml

I had been fortunate enough to have attended my second priest's First Mass or Mass of Thanksgiving. In many dioceses including Charleston there is a very beautiful tradition that occurs. The traditional practice includes the newly ordained priest having his hands consecrated with the oil by the Bishop. Soon after, he would cleanse his consecrated hands with a white cloth called a maniturgium. The newly ordained would present the maniturgium to his mother at his Mass of Thanksgiving. These white cloths are traditionally given to the new priest's mother to symbolize the gift of her son to the service of the Church. At the end of Mass, Father Andrew Fryml gave his mother the maniturgium, which is to be placed in her coffin when she dies. The tradition goes that when the mother of a priest gets to the gates of Heaven, she would be asked "What did you give to God during your life?" The mother can respond: "I gave you my son as a priest." There was not a dry eye in the church. The tradition also continues for the father, who Father Fryml gave his stole from his first confession to his dad because of the role that his father had in guiding him through his life.

Another beautiful tradition in the church is to ask a new priest for his first blessing. After both his Mass of Thanksgiving, Father Fryml had a line of people waiting for a blessing. Many parishioners waited in line for over two hours for his blessing.


BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH

You learned also the powerful lesson of unity; and unity, my brothers, means keeping ourselves together in carrying out the high aims and purposes of our Order. When receiving Knightly honors in this Order, you were pronounced the hope of Church and State. Be you ever, therefore, valiant sons of Holy Church and upright and loyal citizens of the State.

Our Holy Father, the Vicar of Christ on earth, looks with gracious favor upon this our Order and asks our valor and aid in subduing the forces of error and irreligion that attack the Citadel of Christ.

The Order has acquired fame and honor throughout the land for its world war and postwar work, its public welfare and relief work, its educational and boy life work, its historical research work, its pro-life work, its work with tuition tax credit and fraternal tax exemption, its involvement with the Vatican, its fraternity, charity and benevolences.

SUPREME KNIGHT ANNOUNCES THAT KNIGHTS SET RECORDS IN DONATIONS AND VOLUNTEER HOURS TO STATE DEPUTIES.

In 2016 the Knights of Columbus again set records in its charitable giving and hours volunteered, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson told Knights of Columbus jurisdiction leaders during the opening business session of the 2017 Organizational Meeting of State Deputies.

"We reached new heights in 2016," the Supreme Knight said. According to the figures from the 2016 Fraternal Survey the Knights gave \$177,500,673 in charitable donations. This is up from \$175 million donated in 2015. In addition, the Knights volunteered 75,112,694 hours to charitable initiatives, up from the 2015 total of 73 million hours.


The top ten jurisdictions in charitable giving for 2016 were: Texas with \$9.1 million, followed by California, Michigan, Illinois, Florida, Ontario, Missouri, New York, New Jersey and Wisconsin.

The top ten in volunteer hours were Texas with 5.5 million hours, followed by Luzon North, Florida, California, Illinois, Luzon South, Ontario, Visayas, Pennsylvania and Ouebec.

"I ask each of you, as state deputy, when you return to your jurisdictions to set as one of your priorities for next year to exceed what your jurisdiction did this year in volunteer hours and in charitable donations," Supreme Knight Anderson said. "Challenge your councils to donate a dollar more a week, or five dollars more, or ten dollars more. And then ask them to do the same in volunteer hours. This will all add up to make a tremendous difference.
