Celebrating Wars End

The centennial of the end of the First World War will be marked with holy Mass and a ceremony of flags, pipes, poetry and military displays on Sunday, November 11, at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C. The event, cosponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the

Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, will serve as the premier Catholic commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the Armistice that brought the Great War to a close at 11 a.m., November 11, 1918.

The event will be televised live on EWTN.

The schedule opens at the Shrine at 10:30 a.m., with the procession of 28 historic American flags, accompanied by the VMI Pipe Band. Highlights also include readings and musical settings of a number of war poems by Joyce Kilmer, a member of the Knights of Columbus, who voluntarily enlisted for the war and fought with the Fighting

69th of New York. He was killed by a sniper's bullet in France a few months before the Armistice.

At 11 a.m., midshipmen from the U.S. Naval Academy will toll a ship's bell to commemorate the end of the war and honor those who gave their lives in defense of their country.

Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore, the Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, will be the principal celebrant for the Mass to be held in the Shrine's Redemptor Hominis Church. The homilist will be Archbishop Timothy Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services.

The Knights of Columbus was active at home and overseas during the war, providing chaplains for the troops and setting up recreation centers, or "huts", with the motto "Everybody Welcome. Everything Free." The huts were staffed by K of C secretaries ("Caseys") and provided a place a relaxation, recreation and prayer for soldiers, as well as dispensing items such as coffee, snacks, gum, and candy.

From the State Deputy Edward M. Griffin Brother Knights,

On Nov. 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, I had the pleasure of representing South Carolina at the State Deputies Mid-Winter Meeting in Houston, Texas. The weekend was very informative with topics ranging from our Safe Environment Program to a new electronic means of establishing a Council's prospect list. At the get together dinner on Friday evening, our Supreme Knight informed us that "This year, our challenge as Catholics will be the greatest we have to endure since 9/11". He was speaking of the recent events of the allegations of cover ups by Cardinals and Bishops in Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and Washington, DC in the transferring of Priests accused of sexual misconduct. Our Cardinals, Bishops, Priests, and Chaplains need continuous support from our Councils and members. We need to make them aware that going forward, the Knights of Columbus will always be there for them.

During the weekend, one of the major topics we discussed was the Safe Environment Program that is sponsored by the Supreme Council. I have appointed our State Advocate, Paul Burchell, to insure that we achieve 100% compliance for all members that are required to undergo training and background checks. All Brother Knights serving in key leadership roles must be trained to safeguard children and other vulnerable persons. The basis of the Safe Environment Program is the completion of Forms 185 and 365 by the Grand Knight of each Council. To date, all Councils have completed Form 185, however, 12 Councils have not completed Form 365. I have asked our State Warden, Jeff Crouch, to take on the responsibility of contacting each GK of those Councils and have this form completed and sent to Fraternal Services as soon as possible. Although this will increase the number of members that are required to take the Safe Environment Program course, it will insure that all Councils and the State Council will be fully compliant in this program.

Our Supreme Knight mentioned that the new Online Membership program is the preferred method of joining. Since the online program has started, over 3000 members have joined

From the Vocations Director

Our clergy are under attack. Given the recent revelations of sexual abuse and the cover up in some dioceses, all priests are having to answer questions and defend the Catholic Church. This even trickles down to seminarians as they are being asked "Why do you want to be a priest" We need to give both our love and prayers as they undergo a barrage of questions and attacks.

This is not just an isolated problem for the church in the US, but a global issue. During the month of September, I back packed the 500 mile el Camino de Santiago across northern Spain with Father Mike Hanifin, the immediate past national chaplain for the National Catholic Committee on Scouting. Each night we would try to meet new people from around the world and discuss their pilgrimages. One night, Father Mike introduced himself, and I mentioned that I had a son in the seminary. One gentleman from Australia and one from Ireland lit into Father Mike about the abuse by clergy in their countries. The one from Australia tried to convince me that my son should find another vocation. All we could do, was to let them vent their frustrations. Obviously I will not pass their concerns along to my son, but it points out what kinds of issues that our clergy and future priests are dealing with. Anyone that has ever had a bad experience with the church, is jumping on the band wagon.

On November 1st, I stepped down as chair of the Diocese of Charleston Catholic Committee on Scouting after 14 years. I will still be involved with the committee but I am presently the national chair-elect of the National Catholic Committee on Scouting and will become the national chair in April. I will continue to do all my other roles with the Knights and my parish as needed to pass on my role as diocesan chair.

On Monday, in my new role, I was a host for the Bishops Breakfast at the USCCB Bishops meeting in Baltimore sponsored by the National Catholic Committee on Scouting. Security was extremely tight. If you did not have the proper credentials, you were not allowed in. In front of the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront, it was a circus. Several unmanned professionally printed posters were leaning up against the wall proclaiming that Catholics were not Christians and did not believe in the Bible. (I wondered if the same nuts we see in Columbia each January on the Right to Life March, had journeyed to Baltimore). Just a few feet down there was a pool of cameras and reporters (approximately 25) talking to 2 or 3 protesters. Obviously the press had an agenda to pursue and were giving this small group a forum to vent.

Please consider sending a letter of support from your council to your priests. They need to know that as Knights that we



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CEREMONY FOR THE DISPOSAL OF UNSERVICEABLE FLAGS

(All assemble near flagpole or other suitable location) (If music is used), (National Anthem) Honor Guard/Members salute/present swords.

Faithful Commander: Faithful Navigator, we wish to present a number of unserviceable Flags of our Country for inspection and disposal.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Commander advance with your detail and present the Flags for disposal and inspection.

(Faithful Commander calls his detail to attention. They form at the Post of the Commander then march with two of the Flags which are to be inspected to the Faithful Pilot. The Faithful Commander steps one pace forward and salutes with sword).

Faithful Commander: Faithful Pilot, we present these unserviceable Flags for your inspection.

Faithful Pilot: Is the present condition of these Flags the result of their usual service as the Emblem of our Country.

Faithful Commander: These Flags have become faded and worn over the graves of our departed comrades and the soldier, sailor and airmen dead of all our nation's wars. (Pilot opens and inspects one or two flags).

Faithful Pilot: Present these Flags to the Faithful Admiral for his inspection. (The Faithful Commander salutes with sword, about faces, commands the detail) About Face, (crosses behind the detail and takes his post at its left, commands) Forward March. (The detail marches to within two paces of the Faithful Admiral, halts and proceeds as before.)

Faithful Commander: Faithful Admiral, we present these Flags which have been inspected by the Faithful Pilot, for your further inspection. (Admiral opens and inspects one or two flags).

Faithful Admiral: Have any of these Flags served any other purpose?

Faithful Commander: Some of these Flags have been displayed in various public places.

Faithful Admiral: Present them to the Faithful Navigator for final inspection and fitting disposal.

(The Faithful Commander salutes with sword, about faces, commands the detail), About Face, (Crosses behind the detail and takes position on its left commands), Forward March. (The detail marches to center, turns right, halts within two

paces of the Faithful Navigator, Faithful Commander steps one pace forward and salutes with sword.)

Faithful Commander: Faithful Navigator, we have the honor to present for final inspection and proper disposal these Flags of our Country.

Faithful Navigator: Have these Flags been inspected by the Faithful Pilot and Faithful Admiral?

Faithful Commander: They Have.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Pilot, what does your inspection show and what do you recommend?

Faithful Pilot: Faithful Navigator, I have inspected these flags and all the flags on the table. Since these Flags have become unserviceable in a worthy cause, I recommend that they be honorably retired from further service.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Admiral, what does your inspection show and what do you recommend?

Faithful Admiral: Faithful Navigator, I too have inspected all these flags. Since these Flags have become faded and worn in a tribute of service and love, I also recommend that they be fittingly destroyed.

Faithful Navigator: Sir Knights, we have presented here these Flags of our Country which have been inspected and condemned as unserviceable. They have reached their present state in a proper service of tribute, memory and love.

A Flag may be a flimsy bit of printed gauze, or a beautiful banner of finest silk. Its intrinsic value may be trifling or great; but its real value is beyond price, for it is a precious symbol of all that we and our comrades have worked for and lived for, and died for a free Nation of free men, true to the faith of the past, devoted to the ideals and practice of Justice, Freedom and Democracy.

Let these faded Flags of our Country be retired and destroyed with respectful and honorable rites and their places be taken by bright new Flags of the same size and kind, and let no grave of our soldier, sailor or airman dead be un-honored or unmarked. Faithful Commander, assembles the Color Guard, escort the detail bearing the Flags and destroy these Flags by burning. The members shall stand at attention.

Faithful Navigator: The Commander (or Chaplain) will offer prayer.

Commander (or Chaplain): Almighty God, Captain of all hosts and Commander over all, bless and consecrate this present hour. We thank Thee for our Country and its Flag, and for the liberty for which it stands. To clean and purging flame we commit these Flags, worn-out in worthy service. As they yield their substance to the fire, may Thy Holy Light spread

the Knights of Columbus. Statistically, over 62% of the online members who have indicated that they would like to be associated with a Council joined that Council. The Online Membership program is not a substitute for membership recruitment by the Council. When possible, Church Drives should be conducted as a means of recruitment. Catholic families could experience the benefits of membership in the Knights if a really good Church Drive is conducted.

All Grand Knights have been informed of the new tool that they can use as a means of collecting and developing a prospect list electronically. Instead of using prospect cards, all the Grand Knight or Membership Director needs to do is to collect electronically, the name, phone number, email address and the Council number. A digital prospecting tool will allow the Council to follow up with a prospective member immediately. "Once the prospective member form is submitted electronically, the prospective member will receive an email from a designated member of the Council thanking him for his interest in the Knights of Columbus. They will start receiving hand crafted emails designated to give them more information about the K of C and all of the programs we are involved with." This prospect list allows the membership team to understand the prospective member's interests and making contact with him.

Ultrasound Initiative continues to thrive in South Carolina. Council 6884 has been awarded \$11,000.00 towards the purchase of an ultrasound machine for the Foothills Care Center. Council 5194 has completed and submitted an application for requesting matching funds. The Council has raised over \$15,000.00. The matching funds request has recently been approved by Supreme, and a check will be sent. The ultrasound machine is for A Choice 2 M8K Pregnancy Center in Florence. On Nov. 21, 2018, Council 14475 will have a formal presentation for an ultrasound machine for the Palmetto Women's Center in Tega Cay. We currently have presented approximately 21 ultrasound machines to various pregnancy centers throughout the State.

I would like to congratulate Council 7062, North Augusta and Council 16903, Chapin for achieving 100% of their membership goal. The State Council will be in contact with them to arrange to have the State Officers cook breakfast for the Councils. Also, Council 6726, Hanahan/Goose Creek and Council 10066, Lancaster have achieved 75% of their membership goal. All Councils who achieve 100% of their membership goal by the end of Dec. 31, 2018, the State Council will come to their Council and cook breakfast. All Councils that achieve Star Council by the end of Fraternal Year 2018 - 2019, the State Council will donate \$500.00 to support the Council's RSVP program. Payment will be made at the beginning of the 2019 – 2020 Fraternal Year.

Please look at how your Council is focused. Have you made the transition to reorganize your Council Programs as called for by Supreme? You will find at this link a very clear and helpful organization chart on how to do this. <u>Faith in Action</u> <u>Programs</u>

We are almost at the half way point for the fraternal year. Of the 32 Programs listed by Supreme, Councils are required to accomplish 16 programs (4 in each category) in order to qualify for the Columbian Award. Also, it is a mandatory requirement to earn the Columbian Award in order to qualify for Star Council. I have provided additional Columbian Award guidance for your reference at the <u>Faith in Action Programs</u> webpage embedded in Article 5, Nov. 2018. Additionally, to the above link I would also encourage you to refer to the <u>Faith in Action Handbook</u> for a complete Guide to organize your **Council Program** effort.

HEADS-UP! A revised Columbian Award Application, Form SP-7, has been issued by Supreme. The accomplishment of Faith in Action Programs is a major part of the information required. Supreme requires each Council to submit a preliminary/mock, SP-7 to your District Deputy and a copy to the Program Director of Faith in Action (Due December 31, 2018) stclair33@bellsouth.net. Additionally, as in years past your Council is required to complete the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities (#1728), by January 31. Please watch for communication regarding a December webinar on completing the new Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities (#1728).

I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands One Nation, Under God, with liberty and justice for all.

Faithful Navigator: I thank all for attending this Flag Disposal Ceremony. Dismissed.

The VA's program is called the Veterans Administration Volunteer Service (VAVS) Program and its board members are called VAVS Representatives. The VA Representatives also report to their respective organizations and coordinate their organizations support of the VAMC.

The Knights of Columbus has become the countriy's leader in this program. They have established Colonel Charles H. Gallina, USMC/Ret – Assistant for Military and Veterans Affairs to head the Knights of Columbus VAVS Program. 
