A unique exhibit, "God's Servant First: The Life and Legacy of Thomas More," opened Friday, Sept. 16, at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C. It is the only location where the exhibit

will appear in the United States.

The exhibit includes artifacts never before displayed in the United States as well as relics of St. Thomas More. More was lord high chancellor of England under King Henry VIII from 1529 to 1532. He sacrificed prestige, influence, and ultimately his life because he refused to betray his religious convictions.

Declaring Thomas More the patron saint of statesmen and politicians in 2000, St. John Paul II said More's life and martyrdom offer a testimony that "spans the centuries" and "speaks to people everywhere of the inalienable dignity of the human conscience." The title of the Washington exhibit is inspired by the words believed to be More's last: "I die the King's good servant, and God's first."

Organized and sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the Christian Heritage Centre at Stonyhurst, England, the exhibit features over 60 artifacts, most of which are from

the Stonyhurst College Collections.

Right Honorable Lord Alton of Liverpool, chairman of the Christian Heritage Centre at Stonyhurst, said, "The exhibition highlights the contemporary relevance of St. Thomas More, particularly in relation to the widespread religious persecution that continues daily in the Middle East, Pakistan, North Korea and many other places across the globe."

Patrick Kelly, executive director of the shrine, said, "Even 500 years after his death, Thomas More's example remains thoroughly modern. He is an eloquent example of courageous Christian discipleship, and it is our hope that this exhibit will inspire others to imitate his virtues and his extraordinary fidelity to God and to a well-formed conscience."

The objects on display include a first folio by William Shakespeare; a hat owned by More; a religious garment embroidered by Katherine of Aragon, the first wife of King Henry VIII; and relics of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher.

The exhibit also includes the pectoral cross and saddle chalice of John Carroll, the first Catholic bishop in the United States,

From the Vocations Director

With the critical shortage of priests in the diocese, we need deacons to help fill the void. Across the state for the next two months there will be informational classes held in several parishes around the state to answer any questions that you might have. We presently have several Knights across the state that are in the formation process of becoming a deacon. Please take the time to seek out a deacon or attend one of the classes to see if it might be what God is calling you to do. The entire process takes five full years. If you have ever thought or prayed about becoming a deacon, please look at the following steps as to how one becomes a deacon in the Diocese of Charleston?

- 1. Pray and be open to the Holy Spirit
- 2. Must be a practicing Catholic and actively involved in a parish ministry for a minimum of 3 years
- 3. Have a dialog with your pastor
- 4. Applicants must possess a high school diploma or GED
- 5. Complete the application and assemble all required documentation
- 6. Mail the application and supporting documentation to: Office of the Diaconate, 1662 Ingram Rd., Charleston, SC 29407
- 7. Applications are reviewed by a committee
- 8. Initial interviews conducted by a committee; enquirers selected continue to the next step
- 9. Background screening, psychological testing, and VIRTUS training
- 10. Family visits and final interviews of enquirers and wives; those selected will enter the discernment phase
- 11. Formation classes meet for four years and may be awarded an Associate Degree or work towards a Bachelor of Arts in Religion
- 12. Applicants who have already earned a Bachelor Degree may work toward a Master Degree in Theology by maintaining a 3.0 GPA
- 13. The cost varies each year and differs accordingly to the degree sought; currently 1/3 of the tuition is paid by the aspirant, 1/3 by the aspirant's parish, and 1/3 by the diocese
- 14. Wives are welcome and invited to attend all sessions to either audit the classes at no cost or earn their degree at their own expense.

Worthy Grand Knights and Members of the State Council: Councils are stepping forward and recruiting new members and holding degrees to bring them in a timely manner. I ask all Councils to step up their efforts in memorization of the Admission Degree. I would like by the end of this year to have all Councils certified in the Admission Degree that means all positions in the degree are completed from memory. South Carolina has been known for this over the many years it has been in existence.

For a Council or District to receive credit for a degree held the District Deputy must submit a Form 450 to Supreme, State Deputy and the Ceremonial Chairman. Until this form is received by the Ceremonial Chairman, the status record will not change in the report. Any Form 450's received after the 9th of each month will not be recorded until the next month's newsletter.

The attached reports show the status of each council for Admission Degrees and the District Formation Degrees for 2016 - 2017.

PROTOCOL

Dress for Meetings and Degrees

The presiding officer, in keeping with the dignity of his office, should be neatly and properly dressed. He should request that his officers do likewise to set the proper dress code for the membership to follow. Proper dress for this and all degrees is coat and tie. Remember the first impression that visitors and new members (candidates) get is what they see first when coming to a function or degree. Dress for candidates should also be coat and tie for all degrees. They should be told this

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Submitted by the Rev. Mr. Robert Cox, Spiritual Director Greetings my brother Knights. This month we will study the Spiritual Works of Mercy. The Spiritual Works of Mercy are acts of compassion that serve people's emotional and spiritual needs. They include: instruct; counsel; forgive; pray for others; admonish; comfort; and bear wrongs patiently.

The first three often involve a deeper understanding and concentration. The other four can be done by everyone more routinely. This month we will focus on the first three Spiritual Works of Mercy.

Admonish Sinners: Sometimes it is necessary to warn others about the harm their actions do to themselves and others. To do this effectively, you need to be tactful, knowledgeable, and to have the proper relationship with the person. As a Knight of Columbus, you, as a brother and friend, can have a deep discussion with another Knight or family member about certain actions that they are doing that do not reflect favorably on them, their family, and the KofC. Be polite and tactful. Be there for family and friends. Show Mercy.

Instruct the Ignorant: Look for opportunities to share what you know with others. You can help family or even friends with their daily homework or college papers or listen to their presentations that they may have to give in a college or work setting. You will be able to share your knowledge with these folks. That is what being a father and Knight is all about. Be there for family and friends. Show Mercy.

Counsel the Doubtful: The world is full of cynicism and negativity. Rather than add to it, adopt a positive outlook. It is a work of mercy to share your hope with people who are guarded and depressed. Once again, as a Knight, be there for family and friends that are having a hard time, whether it is emotionally, materially, or spiritually. Listen to them! Hear them out! Sometimes they need someone who will just listen, not be judgmental, and be understanding. Offer suggestions but do not dictate what they should do. Perhaps, you can refer them to a priest or a professional counselor for guidance. Be there for family and friends. Show Mercy.

Next month, the final four Spiritual Works of Mercy. Until then, have a blessed month and pray the rosary as often as possible this month for our Mother, Mary.

who was deeply influenced by More's example in his own work to protect the rights of American Catholics in an era of hostility.

More was executed in 1535 for refusing to recognize Henry VIII as the head of the Church in England. More and Henry had been friends and even worked together on a treatise in defense of the Catholic faith. As a popular and respected statesman, More's refusal was perceived as an implicit challenge to the legitimacy of the monarch's claims. Bishop John Fisher was executed within a month of More, on the same charge of treason.

The 20th-century English writer G. K. Chesterton said More "may come to be counted the greatest Englishman, or at least the greatest historical character in English history. For he was above all things historic. ... If there had not happened to be that particular man at that particular moment, the whole of history would have been different."
